Sailing Diversity Access Scholarship



Started in 2021, we are excited to continue this initiative to provide campers between 11-15 who identify as BIPOC a **100% fully paid and supported** summer camp experience of up to 4 weeks. Through this initiative we aim to create new summer opportunities and recreation options for kids who come from diverse communities and families.

Importantly, this opportunity does not end after this summer! The Community Sailing Center promises to provide full scholarship support to participants who decide to continue their growth as sailors for up to 4 years. This pathway begins with learning to sail, progresses to racing in high school, to becoming a junior instructor.

The Community Sailing Center is a community-based nonprofit organization providing access, education, and recreation on Lake Champlain for almost 8,000 people annually. We engage our community with the lake through a wide range of educational and recreational programs that extend an open invitation to everyone regardless of age, gender, race, physical ability, or the means to pay.

Our Mission is to encourage and celebrate the responsible use and long term stewardship of Lake Champlain by fostering educational and recreational opportunities for all members of our community.

Program Overview

Sailing Diversity Access Scholarship is for children ages 11-16 to participate in summer camps. Our summer camps are designed to teach kids the safety, skill, and joy involved in the life-long sport of sailing. The multi-week program will include both sailing-focused camps and Lake Adventure camps that blend sailing and other fun on-water activities. Camp runs Monday-Friday from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm.

 School Sailing or High School Sailing
- Availability for early drop-off (before 8am-9am) and late pick-up (4pm-5:30pm)
- Up to \$120 (\$30 per week of attendance) in transportation stipends to support all participants traveling to and from our facility

Program Offerings for New Sailors in 2022:

New Sailors may take up to four sessions of camp selected from the courses listed below.

Lake Adventure

This camp is designed for adventurers who love to play on the lake. We will explore Lake Champlain to the fullest from a variety of watercraft, including canoe/kayak excursions out to Lone Rock Point, paddleboarding to North Beach, and sailing adventures around Burlington Bay. Level I

Campers will learn the basics of rigging, points of sail, sailing maneuvers, safety and recovery in a safe, fun environment. Certified instructors lead a variety of land- and water-based activities designed to promote comfort and independence in the boat. Ages: 11-15. Time: 9am-4pm

Program Offerings for Returning Sailors in 2022:

Returning Sailors may take **one** of the Level II sessions listed below, plus they may choose between enrolling in either Fall Middle School **or** Fall High School Sailing. If the Fall programs don't work, returning sailors can enroll in one of the summer Lake Adventure programs listed above.

Level II

This two-week long camp is a perfect follow up to the Level I camp or an ideal choice for young sailors who are already comfortable with the basics. Following a review of nomenclature and basic rigging, safety, and sailing maneuvers, sailors will advance to on-the-water activities that consolidate existing skills and teach new ones. Ages: 12-16. *This is a two-week camp that runs Monday-Friday.*

Northern Vermont High School Sailing Team

The Community Sailing Center coaches high school sailors from around the region through the Northern Vermont High School Sailing Team, each season offering young sailors the chance to develop their skills and compete throughout New England. The team is open to any student in good standing attending public, private, or home school in Chittenden and surrounding counties. The team practices together approximately three days a week after school, with occasional weekend regattas at home or away. Grades 9-12.

Fall Session: August 29 - October 10

Middle School Race

Develop the skill to sail our 23' keelboats with a team of other middle school students. Focus on sailing quickly & efficiently on each point of sail. An introduction to the fundamentals of sailboat racing while learning to independently sail keelboats. This program will meet two days a week during after school hours. Grades 6-8.
